3 top tips for exploring our new Gazettes

- 1 Always **check the image**. It could hold extra detail not shown on the transcript
- 2 Sometimes, **first names are represented by initials**. Try searching with just a last name and year
- Juse the **optional keyword search** to pinpoint other details like places or events
