

The Huguenots were the Protestants of France. In the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth centuries, they suffered severe persecution in their homeland because they did not follow the Catholic faith. In 1685 King Louis XIV revoked the Edict of Nantes, making it illegal to be a Protestant in France.

At that time, almost 200,000 Huguenots fled France to any country that would take them, principally Switzerland, Germany, the Netherlands, England, and Ireland.

Everywhere they went, they took their religious faith, their artisanal skills, and their work ethic. They contributed enormously to every country which welcomed them.




# Books Name Accumulation Index (QBNI) June 2022


The QFHS Books – Name Accumulation Index is nearing 300,000 names. That was the target for the end of 2022. A fantastic effort by our Indexing Team.

# A Message from our President



Twelve QFHS members have commenced work on an ambitious agenda for their term on the Management Committee 2022-23. *Our premises, both current & future, are a major focus for the MC*. As most members will be aware, our current premises is part of a large industrial estate & we understand the new owners, at some stage, will develop the site. We believe the development process for a site such as ours will take 15-24 months to complete so, while QFHS will be relocating, we do have time on our side for a planned & orderly relocation. Rest assured, the search for new premises continues, & we are in active discussions with Brisbane City Council about a community facility currently available. While the premises has many attractive features (it's of solid construction, in very good condition being recently refurbished, with good parking), it's also considerably more compact than our Gaythorne premises so we've begun thinking about the implications of this & investigating the possibilities of creating something larger.

While our future premises is a matter of concern for all members of the MC, the nitty-

gritty will be dealt with by a *Future Premises sub-committee* comprised of MC members Chris Gibbs, Clem Ditton, Charlotte Sale, & Chris Schuetz, plus Richard Cosgrove & Assistant Treasurer Wendy Angliss. Together, the group has a professional expertise, longstanding involvement in the search for new premises, prior experience in community facility development, & IT stakeholder input.

The shape of our required premises & the services the Society will provide - as defined by current membership & as projected for the next generation/s of users - is a primary task for MC over the next few months. Stay tuned!

The manner in which QFHS presents itself to the world affects the way the world sees us. Our physical premises, our virtual presence, our communication channels (Snippets, journal, social media), our interactions with the community (Open Days, our presence at conferences & community events) - these all need to be fresh, attractive, informative, & engaging.

Our members & volunteers need a safe environment at our premises & they deserve pleasant surroundings. Plus, we do ourselves a disservice if potential members don't find us looking as if QFHS is a vibrant organisation worthy of their attention. *MC has agreed our current premises needs some TLC & has approved expenditure for the following*:

- Extra investment in cleaning a mid-winter Spring Clean.
- Replacement of a very sad letterbox
- Painting of selected areas the front entrance from gate to front doors, & a
  freshen up to the main interior room. A painter has been engaged & work will
  be undertaken over two days. Consequently, the Library & Resource Centre
  will be closed Friday 29 JUL & Saturday 30 JUL.
- New signage facing the rail lines to promote the Society to the thousands of rail commuters who pass our premises daily. We should make the most of this opportunity to promote the Society.

These are areas needing immediate attention & MC feels the expenditure will be sufficient to address the issues & to make a difference for the next 15-24 months.

The benefits of MC's investment in our current premises will be sustained by the activities of a *Facilities Manager*, someone who'll keep a good eye on the premises & address issues as they arise. I'm very pleased new MC member, *John Young*, has agreed to take on that role, which encompasses management of

- Health & safety issues incl. COVID compliance
- the cleaning contract
- repairs & maintenance
- grounds lawns & garden
- supplies kitchen, cleaning

John has started work on a lengthy To Do list & will need the assistance of a team to cover all the areas adequately. Doug Eager's already on the team – he's been mowing the lawns for some time (it's appreciated, Doug) & Chris Gibbs has volunteered as someone handy with tools (great news, thanks Chris). There are other tasks we'd be grateful for volunteers to pitch into...garden maintenance, laundering the kitchen tea- & hand-towels, purchasing kitchen supplies, are just a few.

Our Society is a community of volunteers & it relies on many people, each doing what they can where they can, to keep the organisation strong, healthy & functioning well.

Do you love getting out into the garden? Could you spend an hour in our garden now & then?

Could you take a few items home to add to your own laundry? (Definitely no ironing required)

Could you find time to include a separate purchase of a few kitchen & cleaning supplies once a fortnight/month when you're out shopping? If so, please let us know – email either John (facilities@qfhs.org.au) or me (president@qfhs.org.au) – we'd love to hear from you.
