

Of course, the Society's name will be clearly linked to the facility but

The relocation of our Society's physical assets from Gaythorne to Chermside is an ongoing and mammoth task. The Management Committee would like to acknowledge the contribution made by so many thus far, in the secure knowledge that there are many others who've indicated a willingness to assist and are awaiting the call to start. We will be in touch.

I hope to greet many of our wonderful volunteers at the Volunteers Morning Tea to be held on November 21st at the Kedron-Wavell Services Club in Chermside. The Society could not provide services and support to our members without your generous contributions of time, knowledge and energy and the event gives us a chance to celebrate all we've achieved together during the year. It is also a fitting occasion for presentation of the 2022 Services to Family History Award.

We are acutely aware that a growing number of our volunteers make their important contributions without ever setting foot in our premises and do all their volunteering for the Society online. ## **Urgent Update - Sevices Outage**

#### Interruption to Subscription Services and vLibrary

Access to subscription services (eg Ancestry, FindMyPast, MyHeritage, The Genealogist, FamilySearch and Irish Roots) is not possible at the moment, either in the library or from home. Searching the vLibrary catalogue is possible at the Research Centre at Gaythorne but not from home.

We are investigating the issues with our telecommunications provider and hope to resume normal service as soon as possible.

In the meantime, please be patient with our library assistants, as we attempt to find work-arounds for you e.g. for NameIndex look ups on DataSearch. You will be able to search for many titles on Trove or the SLQ database. During the outage it may be possible to access Ancestry at your local library and some local libraries also have access to FindMyPast.

## My Life Story - Dr Colin Dillon

Dr Colin Dillon is a Kombumerri man of the Yugambeh nation. His Country is Queensland's Gold Coast but his extraordinary life has taken him all over the State, and he has now been recognised as the 2022 Queensland Senior Australian of the Year, and Australia's first Indigenous police officer.

Dr Dillon stepped into the uniform two years before the 1967 referendum, which saw the counting of Aboriginal people in the nation's census, and a decade before ratification of the Racial Discrimination Act.

He was the first serving police officer to voluntarily come forward and give first-hand evidence under oath to the Fitzgerald Enquiry in 1987. (Image Credit "By Sarah Smit, National Indigenous Times")

Queensland School Pupils Index (QSPI) Part 7

New Records Added

A further 278,000 entries have just been added to the online Queensland School Pupils Index Part 7 database.

The additional data includes names from 202 schools – all excepting two schools from admission registers. The schools include both large and small from across Queensland – including a number of very large schools such as Aspley SS, Balmoral SHS, Burleigh Heads SS, and Bundaberg Central SS, smaller schools such as Boulia SS, Bli Bli SS, Bowen SS, and Cairns Central Infants SS and other very small schools such as Buckland SS, Cassowary SS, Cockatoo Creek SS, and Fortune's Crossing SS.

Check the uploaded List of schools for all those marked "new" to find out all the 202 schools that have had records added.
