My dad recorded, on Cine 8 film, the whole trip from leaving our home town in Yorkshire by train, to sailing from Southhampton to Wellington via the Panama Canal.

Mum wrote about the voyage and settling into a new country. Dad edited the Cine film and set it to music, whilst Mum did the narration. It took them many hours. They both moved back to Harrowgate, England and are both 90.

Putting Meat on your Ancestors' Bones

The trade title your ancestor used in official documentation sometimes reveal what he sold, his origins, his type of customer and even his religion.

Check the definitions below to see if your

ancestors' trade is listed here:-

- BUISTEIR: An Irish butcher (often in Irish Catholic immigrant areas).
- **BUTCHER CHANDLER:** One who supplied meat and other goods to the captains of sailing vessels, usually on contract.
- CADDY BUTCHER: One who specialised in selling horse meat.
- · CIGYDD: A Welsh butcher
- HALAL BUTCHER: One who prepared meat for sale according to Islamic laws.
- JOBBER: Someone who sold his meat from a basket, often to pub landlords and their customers.
- **PORK BUTCHER:** One who sold only pork, lard and pork-filled pastry products such as pies and sausage rolls.
- **POULTERER:** Butcher specialising in poultry and bird meat products.
- SAWN BUTCHER: A butcher who sold only bacon.
- **TROTTER:** A butcher who sold his wares from a horse and cart to village dwellers, he was also known as a hawking butcher.


