Queensland Globe: get hands-on with Queensland geography

Queensland Globe is an interactive mapping website providing access to the spatial information held by the Queensland Government. It is a powerful tool with an extensive array of information that can be overlaid on the maps, but it can be overwhelming for the beginner.

This hands-on session will be aimed beginners including: navigating around the Globe, searching for locations by a range of methods, obtaining information about a particular place, and working with the hundreds of built-in data layers (some of which will be included in the presentation).

Some of the limitations of the Queensland Globe will also be discussed. Note that Queensland Globe primarily deals with current information rather than historical information. However, there will be examples of how Queensland Globe can be used to help with your history research.



History of Brisbane trams and their contribution to Brisbane's development

Come along to hear about the introduction of trams to Brisbane in the 1880s, part of Brisbane's social heritage. The development of Brisbane's tram network is linked to the development of Brisbane suburbs and councils, including Chermside, Ithaca, Wooloowin, Hamilton, Mt Gravatt, Camp Hill, and Moorooka.

You will hear about the first power station in Brisbane city for the tram system and the network of substations along the tram routes. The open bogie cars of Brisbane trams were suited to Brisbane's sub-tropical climate.



LILIAN WATSON FAMILY HISTORY AWARD

The Award and Conditions of Entry

The aim of this Award is to encourage family historians to present the results of their research for others to read and enjoy.

The Award was established in 1983 and first awarded in 1984. In 1996 it was renamed the Lilian Watson Family History Award to honour the memory and the contributions to genealogy and family history of Mrs Lilian Watson who died in March 1996. She was the Foundation Chairperson of the Society in 1980 and the first Fellow of the Society elected in 1995.

THE AWARD

The Award is for a book, however produced or published, printed on paper, dealing with family history and must have a significant Tasmanian content.

In the context of the Lilian Watson Family History Award, a family history should be a work carefully and accurately researched on a single family, group of related families or a biographical history. Historical fiction is not eligible.

Changes to document ordering at The National Archives, London

Are you planning a research trip to England? if so, make a note of the changes to ordering documents.

With effect from 31 March 2020, the document ordering procedure the The National Archives will change.

Readers will be able to order a maximum of 12 documents for the same day, plus up to 12 documents ordered in advance (i.e. a maximum of 24 documents per reader per day).

The new procedure will run for an experimental 6-month period. More details can be seen here.
