## THE ETHERIDGE CHRONOLOGY

1872 The first child born on the Percy was Percy Peters 22-9-1872. His parents were William Peters & Pauline Petsckhe.

William Peters was a carpenter at Cardwell in 1868. Qld. Post Office directory.

William Peters known as "Bare Foot Peter" erected a five head battery & owned the Homeward Bound claim just where the gully runs into the Percy River. The mill was driven by horsepower. North Qld Herald 6-7-1892, printed 28-9-1892.

Mr Blakoe has removed his 5 head stampmill from the Woolgar Goldfield & erected it on the main branch of the Percy river about 2 miles south east from Mr Suhles mill. Q.P.P vol. 3 page 288 1890/91.

1891

At Christmas Hill a small party have the Susan mine line of reef and are prepared to erect a small winding engine at the shaft. This hill is a very curious formation and appears full of rich deposits or bunches of auriferous, early clay. On the summit large quantities of kaolin containing gold have been discovered coming as it were in pipes from the centre of the mount. Stone crushed at the Susan mine since the opening in 1885 is 174 tons. Yield of gold 807 oz 8 dwt from 1885 to 1891. Stone crushed in 1891 15 tons, gold yield 47 oz 10 dwt.

At the Percy a party have taken up 20 acres lease discovered years ago & covered up.  
 Erecting a plant for treating minerals near their property. From the first session of the  
 11th Parliament book 1893 page 614.

The Percy River has been the centre of attraction all through the year. The crushing  
 mill has never been stopped day or night except for repairs. In May last I laid off  
 twenty three separate lines of reefs, containing in many cases several numbers on each  
 side of the prospect claims. This was previous to the celebrated sensation find about  
 two 100oz just lying on the surface, close to the track leading to the slaughter yard.  
 The whole mass was contained within about a dozen pieces of matrix & the  
 finder not having a miners right carefully concealed the fact until I returned from  
 the Woolgar.

No rain fell at Christmas Hill & no mining was done. A small prospecting battery has  
 been erected. Mr Blakoe erected a crushing plant on Oakey Creek.

The only mines of any importance in the Georgetown area are the Wexford, St George, Overland Telegraph, Spero & the Rescue.

There is a need for a battery on the east side of the Etheridge River as all the stone from

there has to be carted across the heavy sand.

A great difficulty was experienced here, as in all parts of the field, in obtaining carriers of stone & firewood, owing to the complete absence of food for the horses & bullocks & the prohibitive price of grain. Many small parcels of stone are lying at the mine awaiting carting. Fifty per cent of the gold is lost in treatment.

A cyanide plant is about to be erected at Donnybrook on the river Delaney, about 8 miles from Georgetown to treat the accumulation of tailings.

The Lighthouse 4 miles east of Donnybrook is deserted & the township of Durham is almost deserted.



- 1897 There is little change in the quiet & peaceful hamlet of Georgetown, & although the business houses must have had a trying time during the last few months of drought, the place appears to be in a solvent condition. Oakey Creek is almost deserted. The 5-head mill has been removed & is now being erected at Percyville. At the latter place there are three claims working & getting fair stone. The Etheridge goldfield has produced during the last twenty years up to 1897 over 20,000oz of gold each year. There was a total of 315 people living at Percyville, Percy, Mount Hogan, Gilberton, Oakville & Christmas Hill in 1897.
