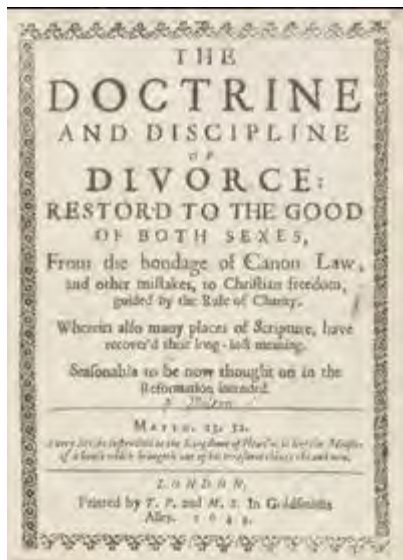
Would you like the opportunity to chat about a family history topic, share your experience, or seek the advice of others? All in the comfort of your own home?

The Huguenots were the Protestants of France. In the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth centuries, they suffered severe persecution in their homeland because they did not follow the Catholic faith. In 1685 King Louis XIV revoked the Edict of Nantes, making it illegal to be a Protestant in France.

At that time, almost 200,000 Huguenots fled France to any country that would take them, principally Switzerland, Germany, the Netherlands, England, and Ireland. Everywhere they went, they took their religious faith, their artisanal skills, and their

work ethic. They contributed enormously to every country which welcomed them.

Online Searching with QFHS



Books Name Accumulation Index (QBNI) June 2022

The Queensland Books – Name Accumulation Index has now grown to 263,437 entries. Our aim is to upload 300,000 plus names by the end of 2022. The most recent upload contained indexes from treasures in the Print Library. Aramac, Charters Towers, Police of the Pastoral Frontier, Sunshine Coast, and more. Do take the time to check if any members of your family are included.



Queensland School Pupils Index (QSPI)

Recently we paid tribute to a dedicated team of indexers who have been working over many years to produce these special, searchable data sets.

Now available on-line to QFHS members [QSPI Parts 1 to 6 \(Combined\)](#), and the recent new addition [QSPI Part 7](#) cover records from hundreds of Queensland Schools from the early 1860's up to 2013. Millions of pupils are listed, taken from school admission registers, some from large schools (both city and country) and others from small country schools.

If you had family in Queensland over previous generations you're likely to find them or their children via these records. It's easy to search. Log in to the QFHS website, select [On-line Access](#) and then click [Datasets by Category](#). Scroll down to the Schools heading and choose which index you want to search. When you select an index you will see a number of helpful lists at the top of the page including: information about the dataset, tips for searching and a list of all schools included.

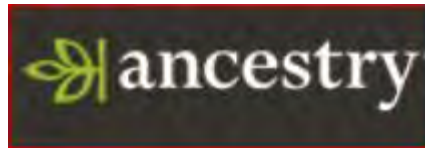
Web Wanderings

Findmypast has added thousands of exclusive Wiltshire records from three new collections, in partnership with Wiltshire Family History Society. New records include:

[Wiltshire Baptisms](#)

Covering nine parishes across Wiltshire and over 300 years, nearly 70,000 transcripts have been added into this existing collection. In addition to names, birth years and baptism years, it's also possible to uncover parents' names.

[Wiltshire Asylum Registers, 1789-1921](#)

-
This brand-new collection of nearly 28,000 transcripts covers eight institutions across the county. Details vary, but it might be possible to discover admission dates and notes on discharge. Earlier records in this collection are from private asylums.

[Wiltshire WW1 Hospital Records](#)

The next new collection includes just over 6,000 records for over three Wiltshire hospitals. Clues such as an ancestor's rank, service number and details of injury could be found within these records. They also cover some regiments for outside of the UK.

[Wiltshire Tithe Award Register 1813-1882](#)

-
Over 250,000 records make up this new collection, which include details of taxes paid by residents to their local church. It's a great resource to uncover Wiltshire land and property owners.
