What's different about researching the Welsh

- Language Wales is a bilingual nation, both modern and earlier records are often written in Welsh
- Names many more Welsh share a surname than elsewhere in the British Isles
- Patronymics where surnames are derived from the father's first name, common in Wales until the mid to late-1800s
- Non-conformity from the early 1800's about half the Welsh attended a non-conformist church rather than the Church of England
- Counties changed their names and their borders changed at various times
- Where are the records I need?
