So many resources are now easily accessible online that it's not unusual to lose half the day on the hunt for records. Has that happened to you? I can put my hand up ...but isn't it exciting when you find that one clue and a whole new avenue opens up to pursue?

When it comes to records in Queensland there's one special place that serves as a critical repository - the **Queensland State Archives**. Here you can find original sources and verify much of your family's background and history in the State. If you're not sure about what's held there and how to access specific information, QFHS is offering two special opportunities to learn about QSA. Firstly on **Tuesday 27 June** our Member's Lounge "**Family History Toolkit**" session will focus on an introduction to making the most of the State Archives. 

Members' Tips and Discoveries

The U.S. National Archives and Records Administration - NARA

NARA recently announced that a large trove of Microfilm Publications and Original Records had been digitized by several Digitization Partners.

The announcement states:

"Several of our digitization partners, including Ancestry.com, Fold3.com, and Familysearch.org, have digitized microfilm publications and original records from NARA's holdings and made them available on their websites."

Their website <u>here</u> includes an extensive list of microfilm publications and original records that have been either partially or wholly digitized by the partners.

If you're interested in accessing these records please note the NARA advisory about access conditions for each of the digitisation partners. As in Australia some records are free to access and others are only available through subscription.

According to NARA the list will continue to be updated as additional materials are digitized.




When Searches Don't Quite go to Plan
