In recent years there has been a great increase in interest in family history and family roots resulting in a growing number of family and local history groups. This provides us with a smorgasbord of possible sources of information for our research and may give you that hint to solve a roadblock problem.

One such group is the Family History Federation based in the UK which puts out a Really Useful Bulletin each month. For those with UK backgrounds there is an interesting article in the current issue on the Story of Emigration. This is part 1 of the article and presumably the part 2 will be in the October issue. Another item which might be of interest is the availability of Ordinance Survey maps from the early twentieth century of various areas of the UK.

Another source, FamilySearch, also puts out webinars on its website which may be of interest. In October they have one on FamilySearch Library, Using US Cemetery Records & Celebrate Hispanic Heritage.

If you are looking to personalise some of your family history Queensland State Archives

has now digitised School Inspectors' reports from 1970s and Coronial Inquests dating back to 1873, which are available online. They also have photographs of Treasury staff amongst other images available.

We would like to put in a new segment in Snippets of hints or other items of interest. if you have come across a book or source that you would recommend to other members please send us an email so we can features it in Snippets for all to read.

Management Committee Update October 2025

General meeting 23 September

Our half-yearly general meeting provided members an update of our activities to date. At our next general meeting in March 2026 the goal is to present a redrafted constitution for members' consideration. If you were unable to attend, reports are posted on our web site.

Constitution Update

The subcommittee will recommence its work in earnest mid October. There are several aspects which require further discussion by the subcommittee and then the plan is to

present that draft to the members for comment later this calendar year. Upon receipt of members' responses any redrafting will be completed in readiness for presentation of the recommended draft constitution to our March general meeting for a decision.

Finances

Our treasurer reports that there have been no significant changes on the finance front.

BCC works applications

Recently we have received conditional approval for our three outstanding property projects, installation of the new front door, erection of the awning over it, and the street sign fronting Delaware St. Our facilities team is working with the suppliers for the work to be commenced. More details as developments unfold.

Grants

The Gambling Grant Benefit application for the upgrading of our IT hardware (12 units) was completed in early October and lodged for consideration. A decision is not anticipated until late February/mid-March 2026. We have taken delivery of our new server purchased with the Anika Wells grant and our TAG team are working on setting it up for implementation later in the year. Peter Gehrke continues to monitor grant opportunities for QFHS.

Volunteering

We continue to seek volunteers for the vacant roles and Jenni is proactive in this regard. She is also busy developing plans and a timetable for the Bunnings sausage sizzle on 27 December at their Carseldine outlet. Should you be willing to assist with the efficient running of QFHS in any way, Jenni would love to hear from you.

For the past several years, we have chosen an illustrated cover from *The Queenslander* to add to the header for Snippets.

The Queenslander was launched by the Brisbane Newspaper Company in 1866 and discontinued in 1939. It was the weekly summary and literary edition of the *Brisbane Courier*, the leading journal in the colony - and, from 1859, the State of Queensland.

With weekly publication spanning 60+ years, there were many (out-ofcopyright) images to consider as a header for Snippets.
